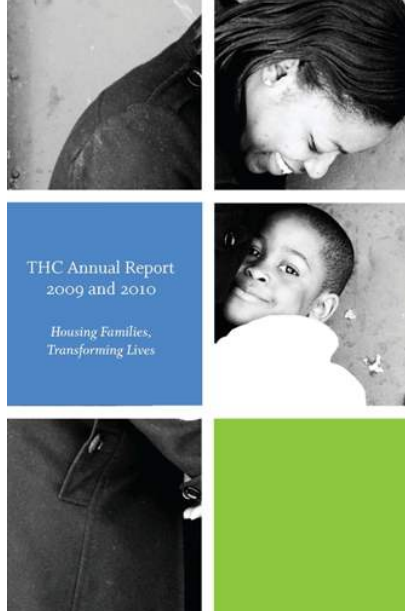

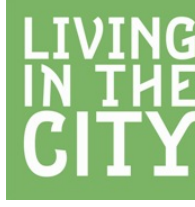

Mom's Pamper Day

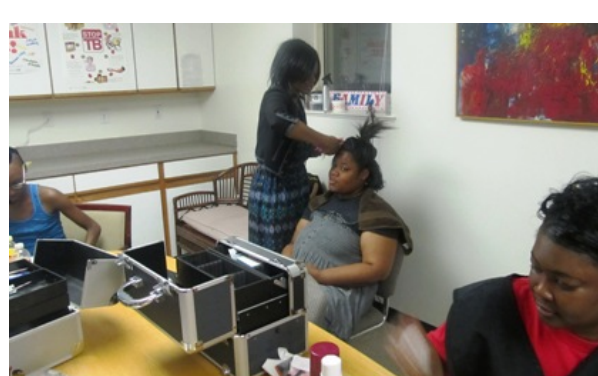
